



**Thomas J. Stanton, Jr**  
**President, Hawaii Chapter**

Mr. Stanton has been actively involved with the Association of Government Accountants (AGA) at the National, Regional and Chapter levels for over 34 years, holding leadership positions as a National Committee member, Regional Vice President, Chapter President (twice), Chapter Treasurer, and Chapter Director.

Mr. Stanton recently retired from the U.S. Army Audit Agency after 37 years of Federal Auditing Experience. His last position was Program Director for Theater Operations – Pacific, and was responsible for planning, programming and overseeing audit engagements for all Army functions and activities in the Pacific, Southeast Asia and Alaska. During his tenure with Army Audit, Mr. Stanton's audit teams were responsible for over \$ 5 Billion in monetary benefits and convictions of numerous high profile individuals for fraud.

Mr. Stanton began his professional auditing career in June 1969 with the Naval Audit Service in Washington, DC. In January 1970 he entered active duty U.S. Army service. In December 1971 he separated from active duty as a Specialist-5, and in 1972 moved from Navy Audit to Army Audit.

In those audit positions from 1969 to 1981, Mr. Stanton was a Lead Auditor/Auditor-in-Charge/Audit Supervisor/Audit Manager, performing acquisition, finance, foreign military sales, logistics, recruiting, and non-appropriated fund audits in Germany, Japan, Thailand, Taiwan and throughout the U.S.

In August 1981 Mr. Stanton became Audit Director for the - Pacific, and was responsible for planning, programming and overseeing all Army audits in the Pacific, and for the management of the field offices in Hawaii and Korea.

In 1992 Mr. Stanton left the Pacific to become Program Director for Intelligence and Security, in Washington D.C. and was responsible for planning, programming, and overseeing all highly classified audit/consulting engagements for Intelligence and

Security functions, Special Access Programs and Sensitive Activities, and Special Operations Forces world-wide. In 2001, he returned to the Pacific as Army Audit's Program Director for Theater Operation – Pacific.

Mr. Stanton graduated with a BS degree in Accounting from St. Francis University.

Mr. Stanton is a CPA and a CGFM. He is an active AICPA, AGA, and ASMC member.

Mr. Stanton has been active in civic and community activities including: Treasurer, Holy Spirit Men's Association; Treasurer and member of the Board of Directors, Parents Anonymous; and President, Treasurer, and member of the Board of Directors, 250 Ohua Condominium Association.

Mr. Stanton has been recognized for his contributions to both the public and private sectors. Notable awards include: Honorary Special Agent for the Army's CID Major Procurement Fraud Unit, Meritorious Civilian Service Medal, Superior Civilian Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Commanders Award for Civilian Service; Auditor General Award, two Regional Auditor General Awards; two Achievement Medals for Civilian Service; Association of Government Accountants' Regional Vice President Silver award, Outstanding Chapter Member, Chapter Unsung Hero and Chapter President's Awards.
